

Since the humanities are found in so many different areas use GIL (Galileo Interconnected Libraries), the Online Catalog to find books, videos or records on a specific subject. The website address for GIL is the following: <http://gil.gdn.edu> .

I. **BOOKS**

Subject Search

From the GIL homepage, click on **Keyword Search**; type each word in a separate **Search for:** box and click on the **GO** button. For example, if you were looking for books on Greek sculpture you would type **Greek** in the first box and **sculpture** in the second box; then click on the **GO** button. Once the list of results appears, write down the call number and go find the book.

Author or Title Search

If you're looking for a specific book or specific author, click on **Exact Search** and select either Title or Author. Type in the name or title and click on **GO**. If a title starts with The, A or An leave it off. For example if you were looking for a copy of The Prince by Machavelli you would type in Prince.

The library also has an additional 25,000 electronic books on different subjects available through the online catalog. You will need to set up a password here on campus first in order to access the books off campus.

GIL Express allows you to borrow books from other University System of Georgia libraries, but if you have one book late one day you are blocked from everything: GALILEO, book checkout, etc.

It may be easier to use the card catalog to find the records in our collection. Look for the composer's name in the Author/Title card catalog and if the card has a green stripe across the top it is an AV material which includes records, VHS tapes and DVDs.

II. **GALILEO (Georgia Library Learning Online)**

GALILEO provides access to databases, websites on the Internet, GIL and other online library catalogs. The GALILEO homepage is <http://www.galileo.usg.edu>. The only section of GALILEO requiring a password is the database section.

GALILEO Password

To find out your GALILEO password go to Gordon College's online library catalog at <http://gil.gdn.edu>. Look in the lower right hand corner of the screen for *Access my GIL Account*: and click on **Get Galileo Password**. When the next screen appears, Gordon College should be in the first box; type your barcode number from the back of your student ID or your SSI number in the second box and your last name in the third box. Click on **Logon to my Account** and your password will appear.

Please be sure to click on **Exit** after you find out your password.

The following are some GALILEO databases that you may find useful for your project:

Grove Art Online – This is the full text electronic version of the Dictionary of Art and contains essays on various art topics as well as links to images of art and architecture. You can search two ways:

A.) On the database homepage, look for the *Search* box and enter your term(s). Click on **GO**. This will provide an essay on the topic. Once you have one of the essays on the screen you also have the option of clicking on Image Links to get access to websites containing images of your search terms.

B.) On the database homepage, click on **Images** to find four major links to collections of online pictures of works of art.

SKS WebSelect – This GALILEO database indexes Internet websites according to subject. It allows you to search by specific terms or to use the subject directory to find sites. To get to it type SKS WebSelect in the Find databases by name box. Once you are in the database, click on SIRS Webselect and use the Browse topics box to find sites by subject.
